Maya Angelou contributed to the arts in the United States by using her form of art, books and poems, to connect with her beliefs and how she was a civil rights activist.




IMPACT IN THE WAY YOU THINK AND SEE THE WORLD

She worked with linoleum block prints to create images evocative of African American culture


IMPACT IN THE WAY YOU THINK AND SEE THE WORLD
