

Louis Armstrong is considered the leading trumpeter and one of the most influential artists in jazz history




IMPACT IN THE WAY YOU THINK AND SEE THE WORLD

He was showing the world about freedom and human dignity.




IMPACT IN THE WAY YOU THINK AND SEE THE WORLD

She impacted the way I think and see the world because she talked about problems that you wouldn't think a 22 year old girl would understand. She also impacted another generation of young poets to learn and express herself.




William H. Johnson

William H. Johnson was one of the most foremost
African American painters during the Harlem
Renaissance. He was best known for his landscapes,
and his portraits that used very vivid colors, and
distorted compositions. He got most of his inspiration
from Europe, when he lived there from the mid 1920s
to the late 1930s.




IMPACT IN THE WAY YOU THINK AND SEE THE WORLD


Kadir Nelson
